#### LETTER OF NOTIFICATION

On June 11, 2015, I inspected the **Accomack County Public Animal Shelter**, which is also the public animal shelter for **Northampton County**. This was a routine inspection to evaluate compliance with the Virginia Comprehensive Animal Care laws, as well as pursuant regulations and directives. Please find attached a copy of the *Animal Facility Inspection Report*, which itemizes the specific elements included in the inspection process. Copies of the itemized inspection forms were also left on site at the conclusion of the inspection. The result of this inspection is as follows:

- ☐ There were no significant findings of noncompliance. A response to this report is not required.
- There were significant findings of noncompliance. Please submit a written response to this report by 7/15/15 indicating actions completed or planned to achieve compliance. The response should be sent to my attention at the letterhead address. Failure to correct the noncompliance may result in referral of this case for enforcement action. Specific deficiencies that must be corrected include:
  - 2VAC 5-110-40: Building is not maintained at a temperature comfortable for each animal. Ventilation is not adequate to control humidity.
  - 2VAC 5-110-40: Some areas of floors and walls do not have a surface quality that permits adequate disinfection.
  - 3.2-6503: The dog run area does not provide suitable shelter that protects from weather extremes. The area was extremely hot and humid, with a heavy fly infestation.
  - 3.2-6503: Adequate veterinary care is not provided to neonatal kittens when necessary to address a failure to thrive. Eight kittens died in custody from April to June.
  - 3.2-6557: There are animal custody records that do not include all of the required elements.
  - 3.2-6546: Reasonable effort to determine whether animal is bearing identification markers is not evidenced on each custody records, as the records do not consistently include these elements of information.
  - 3.2-6546 and Directive 79-1: All animals were not sedated prior to euthanasia.

On June 11, 2015, I inspected the **Accomack County Public Animal Shelter**, which is also the public animal shelter for **Northampton County**. This was a routine inspection to evaluate compliance with the Virginia Comprehensive Animal Care laws, as well as pursuant regulations and directives. Please find attached a copy of the **Animal Facility Inspection Report**, which itemizes the specific elements included in the inspection process. Copies of the itemized inspection forms were also left on site at the conclusion of the inspection. The result of this inspection is as follows:

- There were no significant findings of noncompliance. A response to this report is not required.
- There were significant findings of noncompliance. Please submit a written response to this report by 7/15/15 indicating actions completed or planned to achieve compliance. The response should be sent to my attention at the letterhead address. Failure to correct the noncompliance may result in referral of this case for enforcement action. Specific deficiencies that must be corrected include:
  - 2VAC 5-110-40: Building is not maintained at a temperature comfortable temperature. Ventilation is not adequate to control humidity.
  - 2VAC 5-110-40: Some areas of floors and walls do not have a surface quality that permits adequate disinfection.
  - 3.2-6503: The dog run area does not provide suitable shelter that protects from weather extremes. The area was extremely hot and humid, with a heavy fly infestation.
  - 3.2-6503: Adequate veterinary care is not provided to neonatal kittens when necessary to address a failure to thrive. Eight kittens died in custody from April to June.
  - 3.2-6557: There are animal custody records that do not include all of the required elements.
  - 3.2-6546: Reasonable effort to determine whether animal is bearing identification markers is not evidenced on each custody records, as the records do not consistently include these elements of information.
  - 3.2-6546 and Directive 79-1: All animals were not sedated prior to euthanasia.
- There were critical and/or repeat findings of significant noncompliance. This case has been referred for enforcement action and possible assessment of civil penalties.
